
I always loved coming here.



The city's Central Library, a.k.a. my loitering spot of choice whenever I'd wait for my lab to develop my negatives.










I had a few chances to bring my camera on my commutes to work.








The subway was by far my favorite way to get around.






























Doing what I can with what I've got.





We went on plenty of walks whenever we could, to wherever we could.


We also took this mirror home.

"Keep 1.5m apart. Give each other space. Minimize your time here. Wash your hands when you get home."








The Saturday markets are cancelled, so there's plenty of space to skate.






















This project was shot over a 3-month period, in the wake- and midst of the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic in Rotterdam, the Netherlands.
